What is SSEP?

- 3-year formal relationships between secondary schools and local employers
- Employers work with teachers to create contextualised learning opportunities with Year 9/10 students
- Employers come into the classroom and students go on workplace visits, to see classroom learning applied in action and introducing students to a wide range of careers













SSEP goals

- Improve student achievement, retention and transition
- Answers: "why am I learning this subject?"
- Ensure students make solid subject choices
- Introduce students to key industries in our region
- Encourage young people to stay in region



What is SSEP?

- Framework adapted to fit each school's kaupapa, curriculum and local industries
- Focus is on key subject areas important to critical industries, but also exposes students to a wide range of career opportunities
- SSEP is for ALL students
- 3 year commitment for programme success and sustainability















Teacher time

Time involvement for teachers:

- 1 x after school meeting with employers
- Teacher workplace visits and activity planning (x 3)
- EOTC preparation
- 1 hour focus group/celebration at end of year

Note: From year 2 onwards much of the planning is done as it's generally a repeat of the previous year's activities.

When well planned, SSEP activities work to enhance what you are teaching, not be an extra add-on



Cost to being involved?

Schools: Transport and relief staff (where needed)

Employers: Volunteer time (approx. 16 hours per year)










SSEP impact

SSEP impact

Since SSEP was introduced at Fairfield College, students have elected to take 'harder' maths in their senior years. There has been a:



70% increase in students selecting 'Academic' Maths at Year 12

90% increase in students taking Calculus at Year 13

Compared to the pre-SSEP cohort...

Fairfield College students' actual rate of completion:



increased by 40% for Year 12 increased by 32% for Year 13

Fairfield College students' continued selection of the SSEP subject (Maths) has:




increased by 18% in Year 12increased by 9% in Year 13

SSEP Process

- Teachers and Employers
 - co-design activities
 - identify curriculum areas you would like to focus on
 - remember employers are volunteers, not providers, so will need your expertise and guidance to make sure there is a good fit with your teaching plan
 - we recommend you make a time to meet with your employer partners at their workplace to plan out activities and see for yourself what they do and how it fits with your teaching



How SSEP works

General rule of thumb:

- 3 employers/class (1 employer per term)
- Each employer sees a class 3 times at least once is a workplace/site visit over the course of the year

(n.b. Most employers see 2-3 classes)
